Spare parts (skd) meant for the assembly industries for passengers vehicles and other vehicles 870322, 870332	<ul> <li>The import of SKD parts from India reached US\$ 165 million during the first nine months of 2019.</li> <li>Algeria imported SKD kits meant for assembly of vehicles for the transport of persons and goods worth US\$ 1.766 billion during the first semester of 2019, against US\$ 1.711 billion during the same period in 2018, thus increasing by US\$ 55.26 million (+3.23%), according to Algerian Customs.</li> <li>This increase is mainly due to the imports of SKD collections meant for the assembly of vehicles for the transport of goods, which reached US\$ 437.37 million during the first semester of 2019 against US\$ 260.60 million during the same period of 2018, it increased by 67.84 %.</li> <li>The value of import of SKD used for the assembly of light vehicles reached US\$ 1.329 billion during the first semester of 2019 against US\$ 121.51 million, i.e8.38 %.</li> <li>The increase concerned also the import of parts and accessories of automobiles used for the maintenance of old vehicles, which reached US\$ 199.32 million against US\$ 171.01 million, an increase of US\$ 28.31 million (+16.55%).</li> </ul>
2.	Pharmaceutical products 300490, 300390, 300420, 300432	For the pharmaceutical industry, the turnover is estimated at more than US\$ 3.32 billion. Despite import restrictions and increasing local production, drug imports increased sharply in 2018. However, Algeria's imports of pharmaceutical products during the first eight months of 2019 recorded a decrease of 11.42 %, thus reaching the value of US\$ 785.23 million against US\$ 886.42 million. Algeria's imports of pharmaceutical products from India during the first nine months of 2019 reached US\$ 53 million. The national production of pharmaceutical products in Algeria saves every year US\$ 300 million. It is the result of Algerian companies' investments, which

		recorded 16 % of growth against 1 % for multi national companies.
		The law 51-49 % is one of the conditions for the set up of a pharmaceutical production plant in Algeria, with the majority of shares held by the Algerian partner. As for the import regulation that govern this sector, it stipulates that all imported pharmaceutical product must be accompanied by technical documents which are required to be submitted at the National Pharmaceutical Products Agency (ANPP), in accordance with the new sanitary law, published in the Official Gazette No. 43 dated 7.7.2019.
		For the vast majority of medical devices, the market is very fragmented with more than one hundred actors: producers, importers, distributors. The Algerian market for medical devices is highly dependent on public procurement (civil and military) through tenders.
		The main importers of pharmaceuticals products are Saidal, Biopharm, Pharmalliance, Hikma Pharma, LAD Pharma, Biocare, Pharmaghreb, Inpha Medis, Merinal, Janis Med, Sandoz, Hup Pharma, El Kendi etc.
3.	Chickpeas 071320	Chickpeas represented an import of US\$ 33 million by Algeria from India during the first nine months of 2019. This wide consumer product is imported by Algeria in big quantities. The total imports of chickpeas by Algeria in 2018 reached US\$ 103 million and US\$ 70 million during the first nine months of 2019. Chickpeas are mainly imported from Canada, USA, Mexico, India, Turkey and Russia.
		As per the Interministerial decree dated 6 September 1997 published in the Official Gazette No. 77 dated 26 November 1997, fixing the technical specifications of certain pulses and their modalities of presentation, including chickpeas, these latter should be :
		-Healthy and fit for human consumption
		-Free of abnormal odors and taste and live insects
		-Free from any contamination such as impurities of animal origin, including dead insects, in quantities likely to present a risk to human health
		- Whole, except in the presentation of seeds in shell or split

		- The maximum water content of chickpeas is 14.5%
		- Dry vegetables must not contain more than 1.0% of foreign matter of which not more than 0.25% of mineral origin and not more than 0.10% of dead insects, fragments or debris of insects and/or other impurities of animal origin
		"foreign material" means any organic or mineral matter (dust, twigs, arils, seeds of other species, dead insects, fragments or debris of insects, other impurities of animal origin).
		-The dried vegetables subject to this decree, including chickpeas, must be free from toxic or harmful seeds listed below in quantities likely to present risks to health : crotalaria, agrostemma githago, ricinus communis,
		datura and other grains that are known to be dangerous for health.
		- The pulses, including chickpeas, must not contain defective or damaged seeds at a rate higher than that fixed by decree. It must be free of organic or mineral contaminants in quantity that may pose a risk to human health.
		- The labeling of pre-packaged dry vegetables, including chickpeas, intended for the consumer, as it is, must include, in addition to the labeling statements provided for by Executive Order No.90-367 of 10 November 1990 on the labeling and presentation of foodstuffs , the following information: the date of packaging, the identification number of the lot, the country of origin. When the same products are not intended to be presented to the consumer as it is, their labeling must contain, in addition to the above information, an indication of the year of harvest.
		The main importers of chickpeas THIKA Sarl and Cevital.
4.	Semi whitened rice and paraboiled rice 100630	Algeria does not produce rice, so this product is 100% imported. It imports about 100,000 tons annually, mainly from India, Vietnam, Thailand, Pakistan, Tajikistan,Uruguay, Argentina and Spain.
		This market is still promising for rice because Algerians are used to consuming it. On the other hand, the number of Asian workers in Algeria continues to

		increase, which helps to increase the demand.
		Algeria's imports of rice reached US\$ 87 million in 2018 and US\$ 48 million during the first nine months of 2019. Algeria imported rice worth US\$ 38 million in 2018 and US\$ 25 million during the first nine months of 2019 from India.
		In accordance with the Interministerial decree dated 6 September 1997 published on the Official Gazette No. 77 dated 26 November 1997, fixing the technical specifications of rice and modalities of presentation, provides that the rice imported by Algeria should be presented in whole grains and in fragment of Oryza sativa species. This decree gives the technical specifications for paddy rice, white rice, paraboiled rice, long grains rice, medium grains rice, short grains rice. It describes the nature of the defects and the admissible rates contained in the rice.
5.	Shelled grinded peanuts 120242	Peanut is a product that is imported in large quantities by Algeria. It imported from India the amount of US\$ 16 million in 2018. Dried fruits are mainly imported in bulk and packaged in Algeria.
		The Interministerial decree of 4 October 2016 published in the Official Gazette No. 39 dated 2 July 2017 fixes the microbiological criteria of food products including peanuts as regard to moulds and Salmonella.
6.	Polyethylene terephtalate 390761	Algeria's imports from India reached US\$ 7 million during the first nine months of 2019. Algeria's total imports of these products during the same period reached US\$ 23 million in 2018. This product is imported for its use for packaging foods and beverages, especially convenience-sized soft drinks, juices and water. Algeria is the largest importer of plastic and packaging technologies on the African continent.
7.	Radiators for vehicles 870891	Algeria's total imports of this product reached US\$ 17 million in 2018 and US\$ 15 million during the first nine months of 2019. Algeria' imports from India was US\$ 1.66 million in 2018 and US\$ 1.35 million during the first nine months of 2019. The main exporter country of radiators is China with US\$ 8.16 million during the first nine months, followed by India.
8.	Needles, catheters used in medical, surgical, dental or veterinary sciences 901839	Algeria's imports from India during the first nine months of 2019 reached US\$ 2.29 million. The importation of equipment, instrumentation, consumables and medico-surgical equipment is subject

		to approval issued by the Ministry of Health, Population and Hospital Reform, after subscription to the specifications setting the technical conditions for import and marketing of these materials, according to the regulatory text Order n ° 101 dated 01/09/2005, setting the conditions for exercising the activity of importing and marketing equipment, instrumentation, consumables and medical-surgical equipment.
9.	Brakes and servo brakes 870830	Algeria's imports from India in 2018 for this product reached US\$ 1.16 million and US\$ 712 thousands during the first nine months of 2019. The principal exporters of this product are China with US\$ 10 million, South Korea with US\$ 1.74 million and Japan with US\$ 952 thousands, during the first nine months of 2019.
10.	Body parts and accessories for vehicles 870829	Algeria's total imports of this product reached US\$ 19 million in 2018 and US\$ 16 million during the first nine months of 2019. Algeria's imports from India for vehicle's bodies are US\$ 904 million in 2018 and US\$ 642 million. The main exporters are China with US\$ 4.15 million during the first nine months of 2019, followed by France with US\$ 2.09 million, Formosa with US\$ 1.88 million, Turkey with US\$ 1.73 million, Spain with US\$ 1.57 million, and Germany with US\$ 1.23 million.

#### Algeria's trade deficit :

Algeria's trade balance had a deficit of US\$ 5.75 billion during the first eleven months of 2019, against a deficit of US\$ 3.88 billion dollars in the same period in 2018, an increase of 48%, according to the Directorate General of Customs of Algeria.

The Algerian exports reached nearly US\$ 32.62 billion in the first eleven months of 2019, against US\$ 38.12 billion in the same period of last year, a drop of 14.44%, according to Customs of Algeria.

Hydrocarbons represented the main part of Algerian sales abroad during the first eleven months of last year, that is to say 92.76% of the total volume of exports, reaching US\$ 30.25 billion, against nearly US\$ 35.45 billion, in the same period 2018, down 14.65%.

#### New Hydrocarbons Law Comes Into Force

The new law governing hydrocarbon activities, which introduces a revision of the fiscal, legal and institutional framework relating to this sector has come into force from December 2019.

The text determines the legal regime, the institutional framework, the tax regime applicable to upstream activities, as well as the rights and obligations of persons carrying out hydrocarbon activities.
